increased catastrophic events like tsunami, cyclones, increase incidence of tropical diseases (eg. we see increased incidences in India in last few years of Dengue), reduced agricultural productivity and thus food security; increased sea levels and thus small islands can get submerged.

Further, the water resources are getting scarce. In areas like Punjab, ground water is fast depleting and unabated pollution of Ganga and Yamuna by industrial effluents continues. This is especially cause of concern for India which has around 15% of world population but only 4% fresh water resources.

The prime goal of human development is economic progress. It has brought about the Age of Industrial Revolution 4.0, Globalised Economic System, and International Institutions.

However, unsustainable policies of Quantitative Easing (like European Central Bank; US Federal Reserve) and Beggar thy neighbour policy by China's Yuan devaluation have led to currency wars. These policies have potential to destabilise other fragile economies by outflows of investments from developing markets like India or dumping of cheap goods by China on account of devaluated currency.

When it comes to international economic institutions like World Trade Organisation the unsustainable policy of developing countries dominating over least

developed nations is clearly visible. The Doha Round has not seen progress and threatens food security and farmers in developing and least developed nations. This would lead to an unsustainable economic environment, where weak would start to dwindle.

It is important that the ~~global~~ central banks come together and formulate a global monetary policy framework (as was envisaged by Raghuram Rajan). And also that the platforms like WTO are democratized and developing nations be heard in earnest. The permanent peace clause is a step in right direction.
