"The common but differentiated responsibilities" - one measure of Kyoto Protocol, to enforce the "Polluter Pays" principle also

could not help much. The carbon trading mechanisms, dealing in ~~CER~~ carbon emission certificates all could not stop the pollution and here we are today — If we can't limit the temperature rise to 2°C in the next century, many of the Island nations will ~~soon~~ get submerged!

People keep on exploiting and polluting as they are not paying directly for it, but it's the foolishness on our part to think so. The rising wastes, almost 70 million tonnes is itself an example how unaware we are.

India has tried to voice its concerns about pollution, global warming and climate change on international forums.
