(150 Words) (10 Marks)

Ans Passion act as a biggest impediment to a reasoned and rational actions. Passion is a situation when an individual is in high emotional state and emotions normally unbalance our reasoning capability for eg. In incidence of mob lynching to protect crowd is driven by cultural and religious passion and they did not think about consequences of action and many time an innocent person is killed in such acts.

A reasoned decision takes into calculation outcome of decision, possible result and impact on the person this is not so in case of a decision taken under passion.

However there are exception to this general rule because passion normally

Q2. How do rising expectations, social comparisons, and relative deprivation explain why increased income does not bring happiness? (150 Words) (10 Marks)

Ans.

The increased income fail to satisfy aspiration of people and it could not bring happiness because happiness is not just about material goals rather it is a psychic state as well being which require success in social goals, psychic goals, cultural goals along with economic goals.

### Reasons :-

- 1) Income can not guarantee a peaceful life rather it increase work pressure, tension about conservation of wealth and security of acquired wealth.
- 2) A sense of comparison and relative deprivation will always dominate the life of individual and he will not be able to meet desired goal of happiness.

- 3) Social comparison lead to conspicuous consumption resulting into drain of income and it also cause crime rate as person will try to achieve status by theft and robbery
- 4) Income disrupts worklife balance.

- Q3. According to Maslow and his hierarchy of human needs, why most of the human beings get engraved in the basic necessity of life rather than moving to the self-actualization stage which reflects that human beings are not simply a biological machines?

Ans. <sup>Ans</sup> Maslow and his hierarchy of human need put human need in an pyramidal manner indicating the direction human being will proceed to meet his needs. In his hierarchical theory materialistic need of belonging pleasure, getting psychic gratification, are considered as initial need while self actualisation stage has been put at the top.

Self actualisation is highest stage where individual learn the true purpose of his existence and try to achieve maximum respect in eyes of other by realising his true self.

Ans.

Impartiality refers to ability of a person to work for benefit of all without giving undue favour to his near and dear ones. Further an impartial <sup>civil servant</sup> ~~person~~ must give freely and frankly to political executive without having any party loyalties.

Misinterpretation of impartiality :-

- 1) Impartial person must treat everyone equal irrespective of capability. — This assumption is wrong because it attacks at basic premise of social justice. A person should be able to differentiate between equality of before law and equality of opportunity. Total impartiality will deny affirmative action and special benefit to vulnerable section like women, physically disabled, etc.

2) Impartial person must be policy neutral

This is again grounded on <sup>the</sup> assumption that impartiality work. Only when person is totally unbiased and does not care about public policy. It is duty of every civil servant to be politically neutral but not policy neutral as continuity of policy can ensure larger public good.

- 2) Empirical evidence — other condition for rationality is having objective evidence in front of a person about a action generating certain result.

In moral thinking a person take decision based on individual perception.

A person must be driven by high degree of altruism to sacrifice ones own welfare for the benefit of others.


grounds can be:-

Ans. Eg. - A man may face dilemma to fulfill his duty towards <sup>infant</sup> child and towards his official work.

Problem - any situation which require serious application of mind (or) physical effort to arrive at a particular desirable result. This problem is just a difficult situation. For e.g. Railway safety in India is a problem

It varies from person's belief sys., morals and values do create at a satisfactory suitable condition. Thus answer to dilemma is always both and it is never either for or against. ~~The best way~~ If it is a either/or situation than it is just a problem not dilemma. The best solution to dilemma is given in Grandma's Testimony where he asks to remember face of poorest person you see and to think that whether your action will be of any help to him.



Q10. Answer the following questions related to the leadership quality:

- Charisma is the result of effective leadership, not the other way around. Discuss.
- Why Charisma as a leadership trait doesn't last long?
- What is being authentic? Why a leader needs to be authentic?

(75 Words Each) (5×3=15 Marks)

Ans

(a) Charisma originates from your oratory grace, your leadership ability and your ability to perform miracles. A person is not naturally born with Charisma i.e. charisma itself can not generate effective leadership because without leadership, charisma does not even exist. For eg. Mahatma Gandhi is regarded as charismatic leader because of his leadership ability which kept him apart from every other leader of time. Thus his leadership abilities generated charisma, not the other way around.

(b)

Remarks

(b) Charisma as a leadership trait generally does not last long because people a. charismatic leader need to perform miracle continuously and he need to satisfy demand of his follower as and when need arrives. But it is impossible for a human being to be perfect all the time and in such situation a new leader emerges. Another reason for decline of charisma is absolute power and as it is said that power corrupts but absolute power corrupts absolutely. — 2

(C) Being authentic mean  $\rightarrow$  being true to your identity and character. A person need to give supporting argument, evidence to justify his authenticity.

A leader need to be authentic because this will help him to draw continuous support from his followers. If a leader is making irrational statement without any factual basis and he is setting dreams and fake news people will realize sooner or later and his leadership will be questioned. 

In the following questions carefully study the cases presented and then answer the questions that follows:

**Q16.** A Cabinet rank Minister has been assigned the Ministry of Petroleum and Gas. He is aware that it is both an opportunity as well as a great responsibility. Yet he is very confused regarding his priorities because of the following situations. You have to observe the situations and state whether the minister should go forward or not by giving adequate reasons.

- (a) His family members, relatives and party members come to him for allotment of retail outlets - a sure source of regular income. They make their point on the argument that the minister will not do any dis-service to public because whether outlets are run by minister's people or others, service will still be available to the people.
- (b) The minister has been indicated by the head of his political party that he should use his powers to mobilize funds for the party, because every 'party in power' does it and elections today are 'very expensive'. Also by doing the same, he will come in the 'good books' of the people in command of the political party he belongs to.
- (c) He should focus on implementation of the running projects and carrying out reforms needed to improve the performance of the petroleum and gas producing and marketing companies, as that is the main task mandated to him.
- (d) Since he feels that it would be difficult for him to reconcile personal, party and official interests, he should resign. Is it possible for him to reconcile all these interests?

(250 Words) (20 Marks)

**Ans.** (a) This situation represent a case of conflict of interest where a public officer is supposed to take decision which in turn might benefit his near or dear ones. The course of action

1) direct allocation of retail outlet may bring charges of nepotism, misuse of power & corruption

**Remarks**

- 2) Minister should ~~ask~~ ask his advising bureaux to design a transparent procedure to allocate retail outlets. In such case, a tender (or) open tender can be invited.
- 3) If party worker, relative, members get tender in ~~fees~~ and transparent manner through bidding both public interest as well as official duty will be well served.
- (b) Minister has been asked to mobilise fund using power which emanate from his office. This will be misuse of power as Party work and public work are separate realms. He can take following steps:-
- (1) deny use of official power to gather party funds as he would get stuck in quid-pro quo situation which in turn may result into money capitalism.
- (2) Since he is a cabinet minister he is already in good book of party high command and his honest, no nonsense image will boost his position.

**Remarks**

How he can improve his hold in the party without compromising his integrity.

(1) Reforms and proper implementation of project is an expected work from a minister: This is desirable because it will help boost up economy and it would be good for growth of country. Producing and marketing reforms will also help govt. to raise revenue. which in turn can be used for public welfare. This will also boost party image serving the purpose of getting fund automatically from high spirited individual.

(2) decision of resignation will show an escape attitude and it will give indication of weak personality. individually as well as politically. Thus resignation can be avoided.

~~It is surely possible to reconcile the party, personal and public interest if by putting public welfare at core of all his decision, following code of ethics of his office and his party on his individual conscience, personal attitude and aptitude will come handy to deal with such situation. Q17. There was a conflict between the students of upper castes and Dalit community in a central university. The Dean and Vice Chancellor called a reconciliatory meeting, but it did not yield any result. The other day violence erupted in some parts of the university and some hostels. Examinations are very close. Some students have to submit their Ph.D thesis or M.Phil dissertations. Some politicians from a certain section put pressure on the Vice Chancellor to take action against the agitating students.

- (a) Discuss various options available to the Vice Chancellor.
- (b) Justify why these options are worth considering? (250 Words) (20 Marks)

Ans. In given situation vice chancellor is stuck in a case where he has to take decision keeping in mind interest of students at large, maintenance of discipline in university and also to resist unnecessary politicisation of issue.

- a) The various option available to Vice Chancellor are :
- (1) Impose fine on agitating students
  - (2) debar students from taking examination and suspend them for a semester
  - (3) not allow student to take up examination on certain conditionality
  - (4) set up an internal enquiry panel to look up into matter
  - (5) postpone the examination

Remarks

(b) Justifications for various options

① Fine on Students :-

This will serve as a deterrent message that institution is not going to tolerate such incident and may serve a warning for future harsh actions if student continue violence

This will also help in resisting political pressure and would reduce chances of unnecessary political interference

② Detaining student & suspending them

- This will indicate that vice chancellor is a no nonsense person and he is not going to tolerate any unruly behaviour.
- Despite attempt of reconciliation student conflict turned violent; this indicate that these student from both community are not interested in study and disrupting and wrecking the entire university atmosphere.
- Political pressure will also ease out.

Remarks

Involving parents of the students involved

**(3) Conditionality of Examination & Submitting Pledge**

- Student submit affidavit that they would not be involved in any protest and conflict later this will at some greater purpose of avoiding violence.
- This will also provide student chance to improve their conduct and does not spoil their career chances.

**(4) Internal enquiry panel**

This will settle the matter for time being and an objective and impartial study of reason for violence can be done. This will serve the principle of natural justice and will give student due chance to be heard. This will also help ease out political pressure as action is guaranteed after enquiry and guilty would be appropriately punished.

**(5) Postponement of examination will serve purpose**

of conducting enquiry before event and guarantee action but this will harm large number of student of university. Thus it is not a desirable option but worth considering.

Remarks -

Personally 4th option seems most appropriate.

Q18. You are a senior civil engineer incharge of a very big road project. You find that project contractor is working honestly and strictly as per the work schedule and also maintaining the quality of work. Suddenly his only son met with an accident and hence he is preoccupied in his treatment. The project got delayed and the quality of work slightly get affected. Your subordinates are putting pressure on you to take strict action against the contractor.

- (a) What are the various options available to you?
- (b) Evaluate the merits and demerits of each option and choose the option you would adopt, giving reasons. (250 Words) (20 Marks)

Ans.

In given case quality of project get diluted and project got delayed because of personal reason of contractor who is otherwise very honest and punctual. Thus senior civil engineer has to take decision weighing in sudden problem, delay, pressure of subordinate and honesty of contractor.

(1) Various Option available are:

(1) Neglect the pressure of subordinate and take no action against contractor.

(2) Impose a fine on contractor and reduce his signing amount.

(3) Ask for explanation from contractor for not appointing other person on his behalf & take actions accordingly.

(4) Give chance to contractor to meet quality std.

and take assurance for him regarding free repair if tool get damaged in given period.

### (5) Action 1

#### Merits

- honesty and punctuality of contractor on earlier occasion will be rewarded.
- this will show an empathetic attitude which take into consideration accident of only son of contractor and his mental trauma.

#### Demerits

- loss to govt. public exchequer due to delay and poor quality
- resistance from subordinate regarding inaction this may raise question on leadership

Q19. Ratandeep, an orphan, is a 30 year young who lives in small town of Punjab. Ratandeep does not have much for sustenance. He does some part-time work in a Real Estate Industry as he is incapable of holding a full-time job due to the drug habit.

He has also served jail too for quite some time for possessing drugs, which he kept for his own consumption. He never sells it, nor involve in any further crime. But community members of his locality do not like him at all.

Few senior people from his colony have approached you as you are Police Inspector of that area. Community members have put pressure on you to arrest him, as he is a threat to society. Since that community is a potential vote bank of ruling party, so you are quite aware that sooner-or-later you will get instructions from political quarter also to do the same.

Answer the following questions based on the above situation:

- As a Police Inspector, which ethical dilemma will you face?
- Is it ethical to have strict action against him? Does he has freedom to consume drugs until he is not harming anyone else?
- In what ways can you intervene in the life of such drug addicts?

(250 Words) (20 Marks)

Ans. In given case Ratandeep, a habitual drug consumer is considered as threat by community member of his locality and they want to arrest him on ground of threat perception.

#### (a) Ethical dilemma

The person Ratandeep has to be arrested on ground of preventive detention which is only designed for rare case like possession of illegal arms, suspicion of being terrorist etc.

To arrest a person without committing crime is against constitutional right guaranteed under

Article 22.

Further given person is drug consumer because of his poor condition and difficulty in sustenance and he is not involved in any drug dealing. rocket time it would be extremely harsh to arrest him without judicial permission.

- (b) To take strict ~~ago~~ action against a person who is already victim of poverty, irregular job / community apathy is extremely harsh step. without giving him proper chance to rehabilitate and providing him opportunity to restart his life at fresh point; if the harsh action is unethical.

The person in said case does not have freedom to consume drugs as taking drugs only for purpose of getting high is an offence under law. Drugs are only designed for medicay use and therapeutic purpose thus consuming drug is an offence.

Remarks

① Intervention in life of such drug dealers. —

- There are various policy of government which provide for rehabilitation of drug consumer so that they can start their life again it is possible to provide him help under such policy.
- Drug consumer is treated as vulnerable section ~~as per constitution and Ministry of Social Justice and empowerment and they are entitled to financial support in form of credit to start new life~~
- Community can play an important role in such cases, which may motivate young person to give up drug by giving him cordial atmosphere.
- They can be provided skill under Skill India Scheme of government of India and ~~stable jobs can be guaranteed in such way~~

Q20. You are a S.P. of a district. There is a project of infrastructure development in your area. This project is related to the widening of road. This project has been pending for long time but no civil servant wants to touch it as it is a very sensitive issue because for widening of road, removal of illegal religious construction done on the government land, has to be done.

One particular political party is also supporting these illegal structures due to political interests. Your senior officials have also given a blind eye to these constructions for long. Members of the committee who runs that religious structure went to court, but lost the case.

High Court has directed the state government to remove all such illegal religious structure which has mushroomed on government land. But no official want to burn their hands. One day District Magistrate has asked you to remove all the illegal structures using force. Being the SP you understand that removing the religious structure may lead to violence, even it can spark communal violence also. Some junior officers also showing their reluctant attitude to participate in their work as they belong to same community. Political parties have their particular interest in it. Being the first responder to any public anger, Police may also lose the lives of some of its men.

Answer the following questions based on the above situation:
