



India experienced a drought which lead to severe food scarcity in the country, soon Green revolution was ushered in and India started to produce huge quantities of food with the help of fertilizers and pesticides.

Yet all these measures did not do much for agriculture whose contribution in gross domestic product continued to fall, even today with 60% agriculture dependent on monsoon our farmers remain highly vulnerable to droughts and thus low income, and our population to food insecurity.

→ Effects of economic reforms

Agriculture in our country is free from taxation, yet majority of farmers are reeling under the effects of poverty. The average landholding is less than a hectare per farmer, which is stated to get worse with rising population.

With such a huge population being dependent on agriculture, the

government, over the years has taken a number of steps to improve the condition of agricultural sector.

Various irrigation and power projects were announced and electricity was made available for free to the farmers so they could irrigate their fields with groundwater.

Many research institutes were opened to assist the farmer and produce higher quality of seeds such as the high yielding variety (HYV). Research on land soil requirements, fertilizers and pesticides was done.

Farmers were provided with heavily subsidised fertilizers, and facilities for availing credit were made available to them. For this

purpose the Priority sector lending; establishment of NABARD Regional.

Rural Banks etc was made available.

At the time of drought and in summer season when there is no work in the fields the NGOs as well as govt. to their rescue. Loan waiver is also done by govt. in favour of the farmers but budget of govt. did not take up as the cut off responsibility

During times of droughts the farmers are provided with interest subvention schemes and in certain cases even their loans are waived off.

Agriculture Produce Market

Committees were established throughout the country and farmers were provided with minimum support price to ensure for all a good income.

Allied sectors were encouraged so that a farmer can earn additional income. Milk production was encouraged by the white revolution which became a

Women farmers are provided with special support under the

Mahila Kisan Vikas Yojana. They are provided with training and cheap credit to encourage them. Schemes such as Attracting ~~Retired~~ Youth and Retaining ~~Retired~~ to agriculture has helped many people to live in their own lands and pursue a profitable profession.

This has specially worked for people in the North East. The North East has hugely benefited by the Parvaparivartan Kushi Vikas Yojana which encourages organic farming.

There is no scheme like MKV or without any "MAHILA KISAN SHAKTIKAR YOJANA" launched by Ministry of Rural Development on part of Government of India.

→ Why agriculture and farmers remain vulnerable?

Despite so many efforts, the recent data by National Crime Records Bureau indicates a rise in farmer suicides. Farmers are not in extreme poverty which leads them to migrate and take up migrant jobs for their survival.

We must understand the effects of government reforms and interventions.

The low land holding leads to low productivity such that food produced is only enough for the subsistence of the farmer and his family or sometimes less. Migration and leaving behind family leads

The main problems the farmers are facing are - lack of water facility, lack of quality seeds and fertilizers, improper MSP, and finally the ill-managed/unfriendly market yards. All the more the failure of CSIR is pathetic.

to various health problems for the migrant living in poor conditions and if he is not able to provide for his family then it leads to malnutrition in his children.

Irrigation facilities have led to unsustainable withdrawal of groundwater and salination of lands thus decreasing productivity. Use of subsidised fertilizers not only affect the balance sheet of the country but also affects the health of farmers and people who eat the food coated with fertilizers and pesticides. These chemicals have leached in the groundwater further worsening the problem.

The advances in technology like

H4V seeds may have increased production; but the grains so produced cannot be used as seeds and thus farmers have to keep buying these seeds at huge costs. Credit has been made available but the maximum benefit is enjoyed by the rich farmers leaving small farmers vulnerable to moneylenders.)

The food produced by the farmers which is brought to the APMC falls in hands of middlemen and farmers end up with very little. Uneducated and small farmers are particularly vulnerable to this problem.

One more problem is the problem of wastage. Statistics show that about 40% of food is wasted.

APMC act may be good. But the field workers and the members and the Chairman are appointed by chief minister and they have internal shortcomings. The farmers

Rs. 40,000/- losses of food, perishable food items, fruits and flowers are being lost annually due to lack of processing and cold storage facilities. A country with facilities in large proportion of malnourished children cannot afford to waste its food.

Also MSP is not available on all food crops thus making the farmer vulnerable to low incomes.

During droughts the farmers are not supported well, for the farmers that are insured, the compensation arrives late. When a bumper crop is produced, it automatically drives down prices which again eats into the profits of the farmer making look for other sources of livelihood.

To enrich the farmers and explore income through Co-op. and lot of economic activity and employment to many.

→ Way forward

The declining growth in agriculture giving to droughts and decline in production and area sown of major crops, agricultural sector needs a transformation to ensure sustainable livelihood for farmers and food security for the population. The transformation in agriculture has to be started by raising productivity in agriculture, by investing in efficient irrigation technologies and effective use of all inputs.

As discussed earlier, it cannot be said that the agricultural sector has been ignored, but without the effective implementation of all these provisions, farmers and

agriculture will surely suffer.

With climate change posing as a threat we need to hasten our steps. It was suggested that India is a net exporter of water as all the crops that it exports are heavily dependent on water; we need to take steps to check this.

Organic farming is steadily growing in demand. For the farmers to benefit from this demand they must be equipped with marketing skills. Farmers' markets are organised in western countries wherein farmers bring their unique products once a week and sell directly to consumers; this could be looked into as an option for India.

We must tap into our ancient

knowledge to fight the effects of climate change and ensure food security for our people.

We must exploit ~~use~~ to the technologies provided for increasing productivity and by this we can increase our chances of exporting the surplus produce. Food processing should be encouraged so that our products could be made available throughout the world.

Increased production of food can also help us provide aid to other countries & this enhancing our position as a world leader. But more importantly, it will provide nutrition to our population and good income to our farmers which is what will make India a more


