Nelson Mandela realised the importance of sports to bring a country together after he became President.



CONSUMERISM KILLS CULTURE WITH OVERPRODUCTION AND HEIGHTENED SENSE OF NEED, ESTABLISHED BY MARKETING

In ancient India, the princes of all royal families were sent to gurukuls, where they were to learn the value of education, art of warfare and discover the joys of simple living. In the gurukuls the princes had to work just like other students and do chores. This type of education taught them to value the struggle of life of the common man so that he could take over power and realise he has been powerless to empower the powerless.

A royal prince had to spend the first 25 years of his life in Brahma~~sanga~~ shram (first phase of life) according to the vedas before he could enter the

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Grihasta ashram (second phase) where he will be able to have control over his life and his inheritance.

How far this system succeeded in teaching princes the value of simple living is not known, but the principle behind this way of life still hold lesson for today's consumption-oriented world.

When India became independent the economy was closed to protect domestic industry. Values of saving for the future lead to people saving heavily and thus building up reserves for India. And all this while the West was on the race to consume more! These two different approaches to savings and consuming meant that India stood firm and safe while the world economy crashed in the bubble it had itself created.

Yet, the lessons of the past are fast diminishing on Indians as the values of saving are being lost with the new generation. Our national savings are falling and we too have adopted consumerism especially after the liberalisation of economy in 1991.

The fact that fashion industry is the second largest pollutor after the coal industry says a lot about how capitalists have managed to successfully market to us unnecessary items we did not need in the first place.

Why has consumption increased?

With the advent of globalisation, and opening of world market it has become easier to attain items initially only meant for the wealthy few. Online shopping sites such as Flipkart and Snapdeal have ensured that the things

To add to this, mass production has made things so inexpensive that it is easier to replace things than repair them. Advertisements by popular celebrities, youtube filled with people using things people never knew existed or has created a huge market for consumption.

Fast fashion has taken over vintage and classic. Cheaper clothes will mean poor quality and hence need to replace them more frequently.

Urbanisation has also created a culture of use and throw. Things that take less time to be ready are preferred irrespective of the waste produced. This

has led to issues of loss of belongingness and materialism in people. Also with the advent of ATMs more cash is available to people to spend which makes them more likely to spend on things they do not need.

Celebrities and leaders are also leading flashy and material lifestyles again fueling the need to buy more in people.

→ Issues caused due to consumerism

Such huge amounts of things used have created problems of waste. Cities are choking with piles and piles of garbage produced every single day. Just recently over piling of garbage in Delhi has caused 2 deaths due to sticking of garbage.

This garbage produces harmful gases and chemicals further polluting the environment, seeping into ground water and causing problems of health.

Improper waste disposal in plastic bags also leads to huge problems. For example, if a tomato is disposed openly, it will turn into powder without much pollution, but if in a plastic bag it turns toxic and harms the environment.

The idea of marketing has lead the shops to keep their lights on at night causing light pollution. This light pollution exhibits the production of nitrogen oxide in the air which damages the environment at night thus causing pollution and inhibiting cleaning.

Buying more and more products have lead to loss of sense of belongingness which has affected modern relationships.
