Public servants have been widely criticised of having an acute shortage of ethics. This in turn leads to corruption, nepotism, lack of empathy and self gratification.

Pole of attitudinal problem

- Civil services is criticised of having a Colonial Mindset where they treat themselves as Masters rather than trustee and servant of society.
- An attitude of negligence towards any improvement or its need.
- Attitude of subservience towards Political Executive & a Dominical.

of subordinates which is true promoter lack of qualities like Impartiality, Integrity & Objectivity.

Role of Organisational Ineffectiveness

- The public governance focuses inordinate on rules, customs & regulations which create rigidity & prevent a Citizen Centricity.
- Too many hierarchies provides room for Opaqueness & Corruption.
- As 2nd ARC shows, Monitoring & Systemic Review system are weak.
- lack of coordination between Vigilant Agencies and protection of civil servants under Article 311 also causes an environment of Escapism.

Thus, both attitudinal & organisational factors are at play & need an organised, systematic & routine mechanism.

- v) Adaptability helps to adjust environment of frequent transfers.

e.g. In case of a citizen charter in a water supply office promises continuous pure water, and if due to some issue, supply is not maintained then

Q13. Although India is amongst the fastest growing economies in the world, it still has one third of the world's illiterates. India is now confronting the perils of its failure to educate its citizens, notably the poor. India, being a mixed economy, needs government intervention in the area of education, because education driven by profit motive cannot benefit the masses. But the condition of government schools in India is pathetic. Except for two or three states, all the Indian states have poor educational statistics. More Indian children are in school than ever before, but the quality of government schools has sunk to spectacularly low levels. The children in these schools come from the poorest of families those who cannot afford to send away their young to private schools elsewhere, as do most Indian families who have the means. India has had a legacy of weak schooling for its young, even as it has promoted high-quality government-financed universities. If in the past, a largely poor and agrarian nation could afford to leave millions of its people illiterate, that is no longer the case. Not only has the high growth ensured that we have a shortage of skilled labor, the nation's many new roads, phones and television-sets have also fueled new ambitions for economic advancement among its people - and new expectations for schools to help them achieve it. In the light of the grim picture of public schooling in India suppose you are a District Collector, and a group of poor people approach to make you aware about the pathetic conditions of public schools in their areas. They handed you a letter that contains five problems regarding dismal states of schools i.e.

- (a) Lack of hygienic toilet facility especially for girls as there are common toilets only,
- (b) Non availability of clean drinking water,
- (c) Lack of proper security,
- (d) Absentee teachers and
- (e) Rude behavior of teachers and staff with the students.

Because of such problem often parents are not sending their children. Dropout rate is also high. Your education minister also expects something concrete from you, as he has to answer local public and media about this issue. With respect to such problems how will you go about providing solutions so that your action may become example for others to learn?

(250 Words) (20 Marks)

→ Education is the foundation for development. The DM, also in the Chief Development Officer of

The Chief Lividhan Redressal Officer of the District, and therefore his/her actions are required on a priority basis.

This case is about basic infra issue all redudant & unmanaged & unnecessary think for some non-reactive movements also

- a) Lack of Toilets for girls
- b) Step 1 → Check the status of existing programs that help to create toilets such as Beti Bacho, Beti Padho and ensure that there is no corruption in the current schemes, using Pro-Active monitoring.

v) There is a need to have Counselling sessions with students specially girl children to become more aware about the licity issue and take remedial steps such as creation of boundary walls.

a) Absentee Teachers.

- i) Use of Adhaar enabled attendance system
- ii) Pro-active monitoring by the District Education Officer
- iii) Taking regular feedback from the Panchayat members & students
- iv) Linking salary of teachers with attendance
- v) Creation of a Parents Committee in order to make teachers accountable.

b) Bad Behaviour

- i) Installation of a Mobile Hotline to instantly complain and behaviour.
- ii) Have a meeting with all teachers and persuade & warn them.

- i) In case, no improvement is seen some teachers may be suspended so as to discourage other erring teacher.

However, as Global Warming, Acid Rain, changing Climate shows, unproper means create Undesired results - and thus, Righteousness of Means is ~~Not~~ Sin One. non

b) Gandhi was a man believes of purity of thoughts, and Truthfulness in action. It also extended to the field of environment where he focused on :-

i) Having a sustainable Economic growth model

given that Earth does not have enough resources to satisfy anyone's greed.

- i) Additionally, Gandhiji also believed in Vegetarianism, another way instrument which may help our environment.
 - c) The idea of Humans sharing the end goals rather than the process is seen in multiple ways:
 - i) Students focus on Passing exams rather than understanding concepts, & this leads to practices like Cheating.
 - ii) Employees use unethical tactics like Blame Games, Internet Policies to advance their own interests & promotions.
 - iii) Similarly in environment, we are continuing to engage in deforestation to get timber or expand agriculture.
 - iv) Similarly, environmental laws are such as Coastal Regulation zones.
- Remarks: Modi can try to promote growth.

However, what we forget is that unethical mean like cheating lead to undesired results, such as inadequate education. Similarly, environmental hazards are being inflicted today.

Q15. The Civil Services Exam is one of the longest and the largest exam system in the country. With the bothered number of attempts and nearly five to six lakh applicants appearing each year, of which only 1,000 or less get selected, there is a huge pressure on the candidates to crack the exam and it may lead to the bouts of depression, anxiety and mental stress. Civil Services candidate face many teeths during the course of the preparation. Many candidates leave their families and move to motels for coaching and preparation. 1) Greater self discipline is needed to reduce the pressure on Resource & have basic infrastructures facilities e.g. Toilets with Water in Train.

Peer pressure also helps in making the Public Service accountable. Then, recent incident of Indore, becoming the cleanest city in Turk ~~Sarkar Khan~~ was down to the role of Peer pressure used in Cleanliness Drives of Citizen forums being created.

Q17. Mr. 'X' had applied under RTI Act to the District Planning Officer who was also PIO, asking information about unspent balance of the last five years on account of MPLAD funds. The name of a particular MP was mentioned in the RTI application. The PIO knew applicant to be a political opponent of the particular M.P. The PIO came to know informally about the applicant's plan to discredit the sitting M.P. in the forthcoming General Elections, by bringing these information in the knowledge of the voters.

The following are some suggested options for PIO. Evaluate the merits and demerits of the options.

- PIO should ask M.P. whether he should provide these information to the applicant because MP is third party in the case. According to the act, third party consent is mandatory.
- PIO should refuse to provide information because the applicant might use these information against the local M.P. to discredit him.
- PIO should provide all the information as has been requested whether local M.P. likes or not.
- PIO should seek the guidance of District Collector Cum District Election Officer because information sought is related to his jurisdiction and is political in nature.
