When he witnessed 1000's of people his countrymen losing their lives daily, he worked 22 hours a day and invented 'Enigma' that finally decrypted German codes. 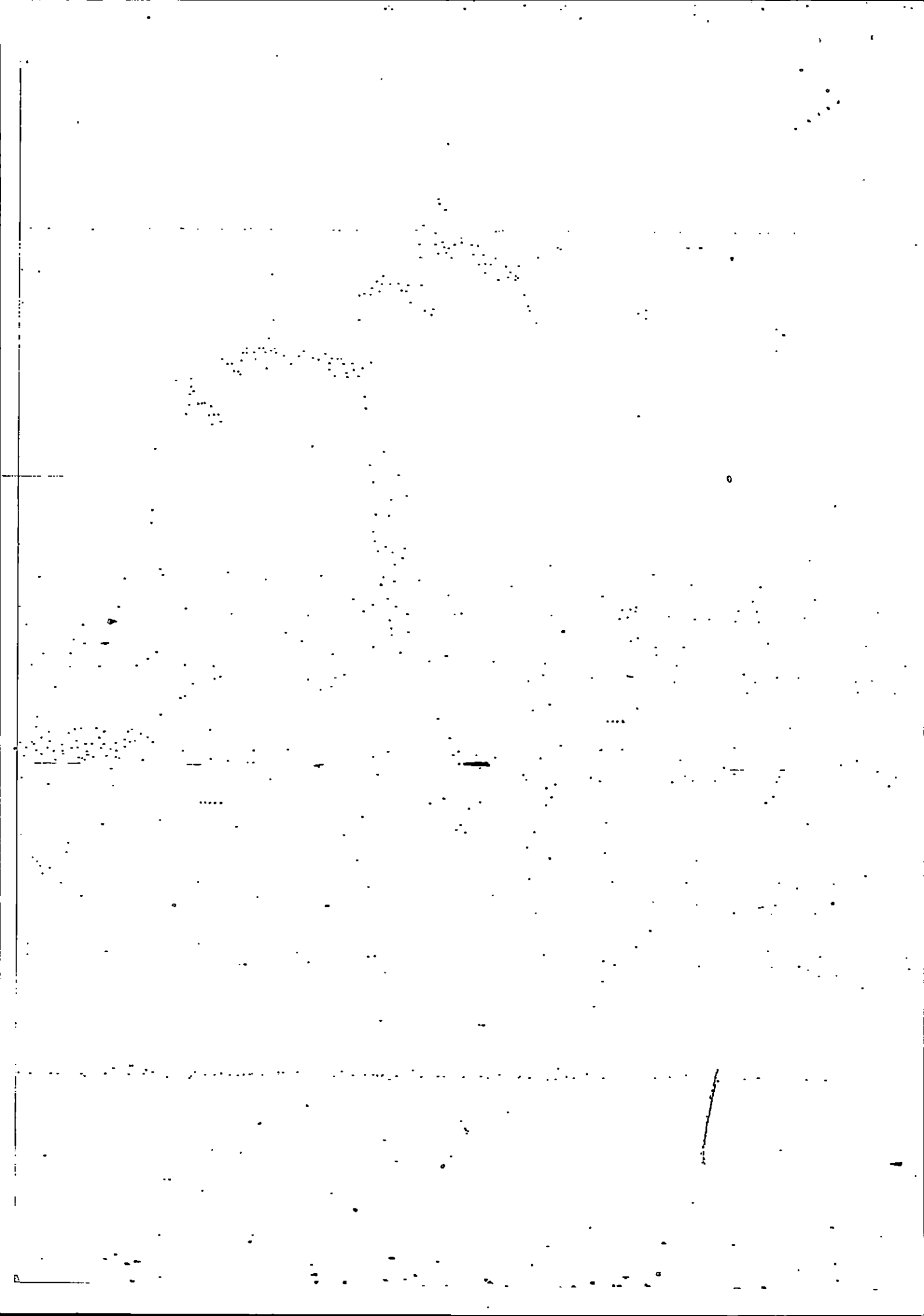

1. Our lives begin to end, the day we become silent about things that matter

These words of Martin Luther King Jr.

a crusader for equality and human rights finds more significance today than ever before. A man is more than what he earns or how much he saves. Human are altruistic beings in general who finds happiness in the happiness of others. One cannot be in peace with himself unless his beliefs and actions are in consonance with each other.

But we are moving in a path where economic well being comes forward and psychological well being is pushed behind. This has led to value conflicts which is

making a man more self centred. One does not care unless his/her rights or interests are disturbed. This cannot be the right way to live, as society is nothing but collection of individuals and if each individual is only concerned about own interests the day is not far where greed will destroy the human breed.

The parochial interests of each person is not only unaligned with interests of the society, but also in disonance with his/her own conscience. The absence of concern and care for others is looming and the absence of voting against crimes is making the evil more powerful. Despite the existential crises and everyday struggle, why should one raise his/her voice? Why is it important?

We have heard about Malala Yousafzai, a young girl who was shot by Taliban for giving a public speech "How dare Taliban stop my basic right to education?" when no one was ready to question the terrorist group which shut down girls schools in SWAT valley of Pakistan, her courage to ask for her right has changed the things for better. International pressure that got created after Malala's propaganda has made the government give more security to girl schools. Today about 1 lakh young girl children vow their gratitude to Malala, whose life is still under threat from terrorists.

Even though many problems remain ~~unsolved~~, a revolution has started. This incident shows that things will change only when we start questioning. But from where should

this questioning begin?

within us. Yes. One should question whether his actions and beliefs match each other? whether his profession is doing some thing positive for the country or for the world? It is a surprise that many of us continue to do rote learning in schools and colleges, go to a work which is irrelevant to what we studied even after knowing that we are being used by educational institutes for their own prospects. But have we raised our voices against this menace which is leading to educated unemployment? If yes, way is strong enough to bring any change?

These kind of self introspections must continue until we find an answer.

If we do this introspection exercise, we will find that what we have been wishing for and what is actually happening to be highly contradictory. Do we care about corruption? No one wants corruption, but then who is giving and who is taking?

When Satyendra Dubey lost his life for blowing the whistle about corrupt practices in highway construction, he got killed by mafias. But this led to increased protests which put pressure on the government to bring about Right to Information Act, 2005. It's no surprise that RTI act has brought transparency and accountability which has made public officials more responsible. But we must ask ourselves, 'should someone lose their life to show us the menace

going on in different walks of life? Aren't we aware of it? Then why are we still silent?

Another thing which shows the apathetic attitude of the society is the reaction to farmer suicides. Around 3,00,000 farmers have committed suicides in the last 20 years. Many of us read about it in newspapers and just not give a second thought about it. The politicians play vote bank politics with these incidents, promise on farm loan waivers without any intention to solve the real cause of the problem. 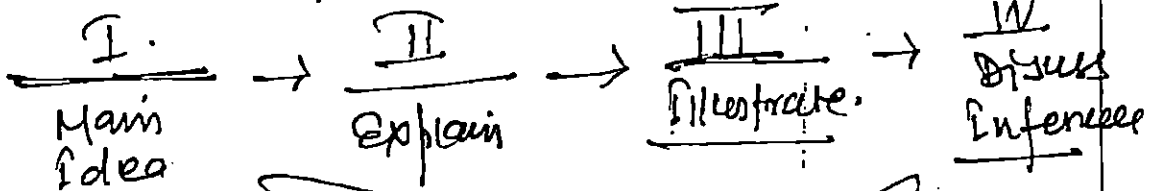
