happiness is the key to success:

In the year that India became the fastest growing large economy of the world, it slipped in the Gross National Happiness Index marginally from 117 out of 156 countries in 2014 to 118 out of 156 countries in 2015.

Indeed, success might not lead to immediate or permanent happiness.

Success can be defined as a sense of achievement in various fields of life, be it personal relationships or the job one has or their social status.

On the other hand, Gandhiji ~~defined happiness to~~ said -

'Happiness is when what you say and feel is what you think and what you say is what you do.'

Aristotle has also defined happiness to be both temporary or fleeting and also a permanent state of contentment. While a good meal makes one temporarily euphoric, a meaningful job might give life long contentment.

In this essay we attempt to understand the relationship between success and happiness by analyzing how they affect each other. and while understanding what makes one happy we will see what, beyond success, is more important for happiness.

HAPPINESS AS A PATH TO SUCCESS
