Q 1. Development is a multi-dimensional process that affects society in multiple ways. With such large amounts of money involved, there is obviously a pressure for humanitarian and developmental NGOs to show transparency and accountability in their aid flows. This means demonstrating value for money in their procurement policies and ideally, strengthening the communities involved.

Clearly, there is a need for NGOs to balance ethical intervention with consistent funding. Conventional wisdom in this area suggests that the relationship between donors and NGOs creates a self-regulating mechanism against bad practice. An NGO's spending is accountable to its donors through audits, which are presumed to be a sufficient safeguard against mis-spending and corruption.
