- Q14. Despite several attempts to discourage the politicians of the region to act as agents of local contractors with poor records in use of material and delivery schedules with regard to public projects, a District Magistrate finds it impossible to award projects to the most deserving contractors. He complained to higher authorities and sought their guidance but to no avail. Not only this, he was shocked to find many of his bosses were hand in glove with the politicians and the contractors, who wanted to award the public projects to unqualified bidders. He was often offered kickbacks to divulge insider information and also threatened that if he cannot oblige these elements in the system, he would either be transferred or physically harmed by the goons associated with politicians and contractors. He was very disturbed, as it seemed to him that he had no choice but either to compromise with the rogue elements or quit the job. He met his friends and sought their suggestions what to do. Here are some of the suggestions. You have to accept or reject the suggestions by giving logic for the same as if you were at the place of the District Magistrate.
 - (a) The first friend said that what is there in fighting a system which is incorrigible. Rather than doing this, the friend suggested that compromising with the elements closer to power would ensure his peace and prosperity as well as security.
 - (b) The second friend suggested that the people who are trying to win contract not only have political backing but also these people are very dangerous and they can even kill him. Making enemy of political class or rogue contractors would bring nothing positive but endanger his stability, life and future prospects so he must compromise and do things that please them.
 - (c) The third friend suggested that in no case the District Magistrate should yield to rogue elements, compromise with his duty towards public service and do things which are against his principles. He should not lose patience and try to find out the possible channels where his concerns would be addressed. While doing all this, he should be extra cautious to safeguard himself from any harm intended by the rogue elements as long as he doesn't find the way out to.
 - (d) Another friend said that the Magistrate should be courageous enough to comply with the blue book, do only what is permissible in the rules of bidding without being scared for whatsoever threat he faces as the rule of the law is always at his disposal while doing public service with honesty and probity. He should try to be tough with rogue elements by using the legal provisions and do only what is right without bothering about the consequences. For undesirable consequences, law gives ample space and public too love administrators who safeguard public interest and ensure proper use of government funds.
