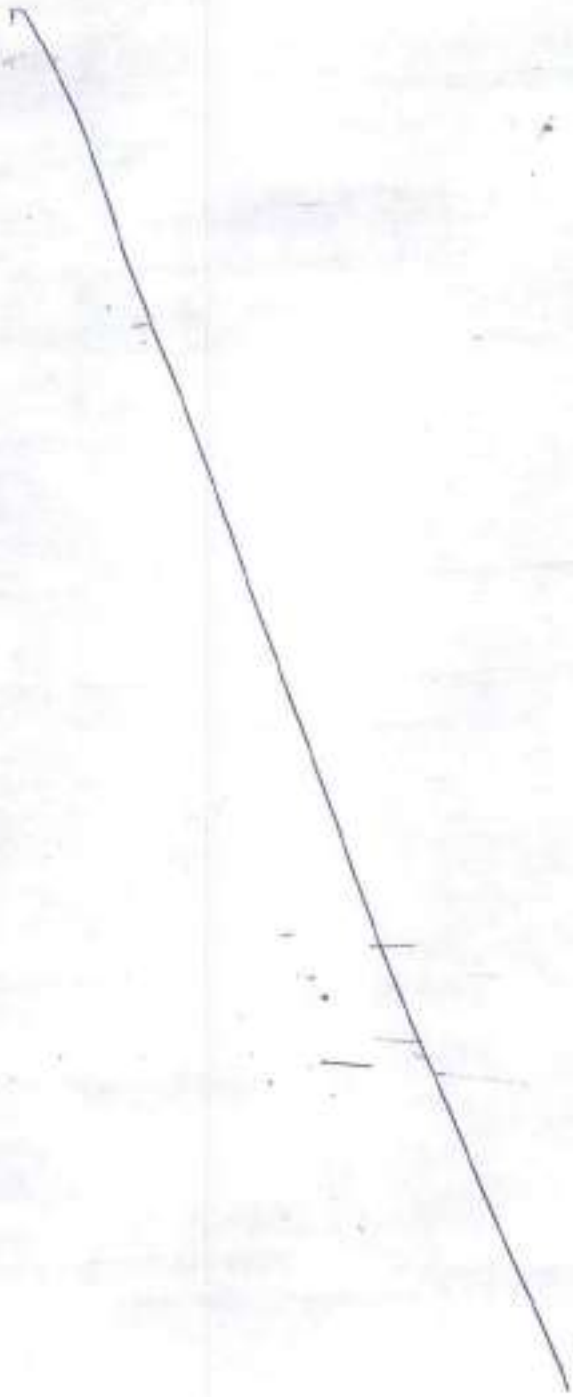

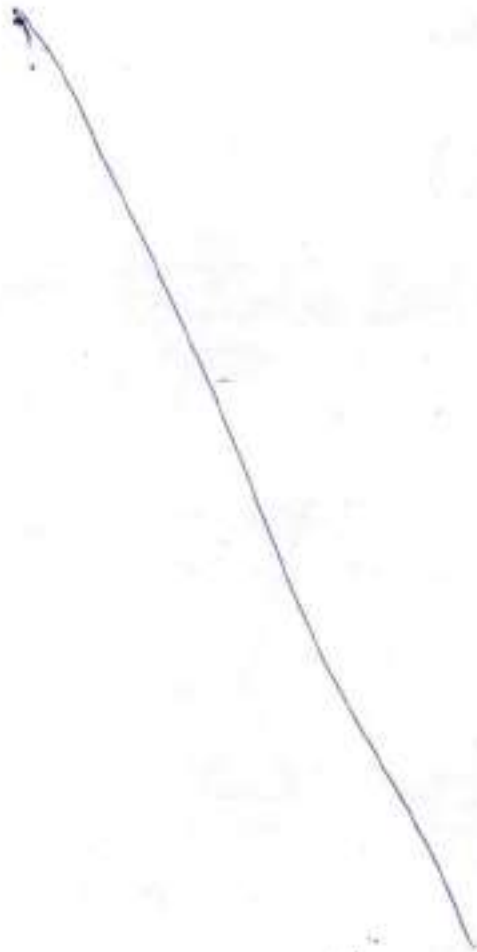
Subjektivitiy Promotes plurality.

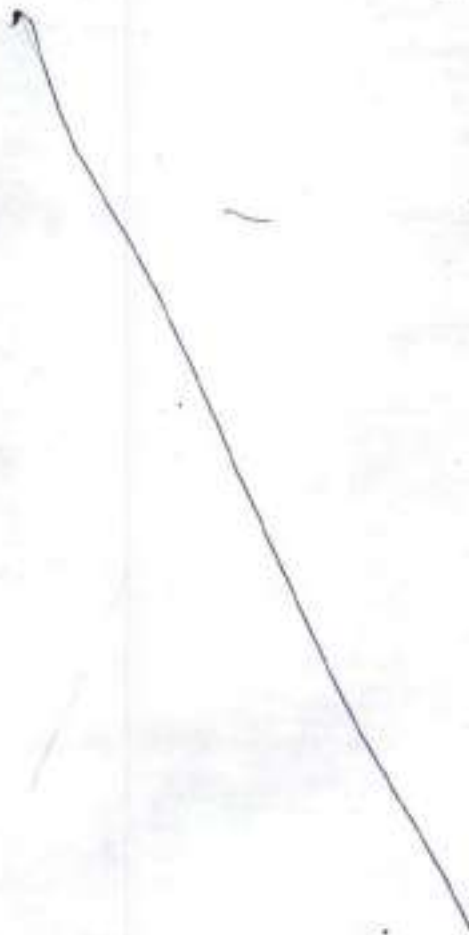

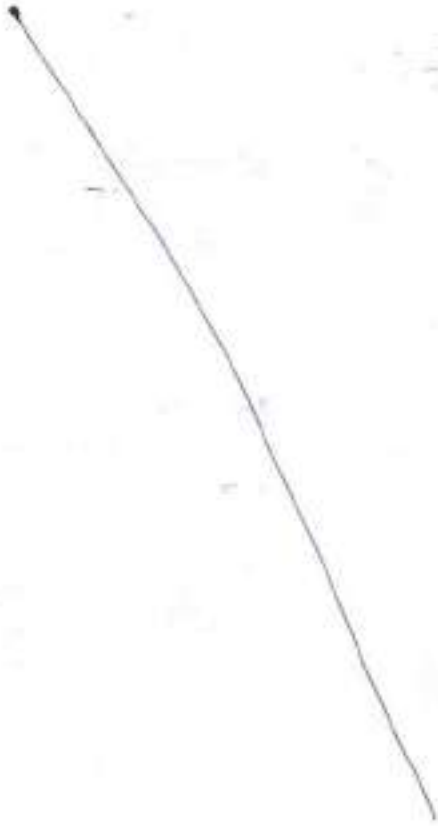
