3. Mob violence, also referred to as "Mob Justice" highlights a striking paradox - it approves the dispensation of justice by people, who usurp the authority of constitutional bodies and apply a process they define as speedy. Answer the following questions related to it:

(a) Do you see the principles of justice being followed in the 'Mob Justice'?

(b) How is it interrelated with the attitude of society?

(c) Analyze why the incidences of Mob Justice have increased in recent days.

(250 Words) (20 Marks)

Ans! Various incidents of Mob lynching, some on accusation of victim being Cow thief, child lifter or performer of witchcraft, have rocked the country in the recent years.

(A) Principle of Justice in Mob Justice

Possible Points in No, the principles of justice are grossly violated, support for Principle of Justice. Victims of mob lynching may or may not have committed any crime.

- They may be attacked on mere suspicion

Eg. Assam Case - two innocent youth killed on mere community suspicion of being child lifters. after the villagers watched some viral video.

→ lynch on alleged rape of a minor

- The punishment is disproportionate

Eg 3 people in Bihar lynched while trying to steal a Buffalo.

Remarks

capital punishment is awarded in rarest of rare cases, even rapists get away with life imprisonment, so death for alleged cow theft & that too in hasty manner is disproportionate.

- Mob is no expert in principles of rule of law & natural justice. They may be biased on grounds of religion & caste

Eg. A muslim youth who lynched in UP when he refused to chant Jai shri Ram.

- Mob may be instigated by a person with vested interests

Eg. Two Assam youth in Assam had a minor altercation with a villager who later spread the rumour of them being child lifters and they were then targeted by villagers who were upset over police inaction in some cases of missing children and thought of delivering instant justice.

(b) Mob Justice & Social Attitude

- delayed justice by judiciary has frustrated people. The famous "Tariikh Pe Tariikh" is fresh in public memory & people deliver instant justice to not

allow the perpetrator go scot free while the victim suffers.

→ People also see the rich & powerful getting away easily after committing crime, so they are more likely to take law in their hands as when opportunities arise.

→ The indifferent attitude of police in registration of FIRs and rude behaviour with complainants also compel people to approach the proper channel for justice & take criminals to task themselves.

(c) Reasons behind ^{increasing} Incidents of Mob Justice

- Rise of social Media; videos, rumours take seconds to become viral and people become emotionally charged. Eg. Police beating of Sikh tempo drivers led to Sikh mobilisation before the Mukherjee Nagar police station & the ACIDP almost escaped being lynched.

- Rising intolerance towards people of minority community and lower castes

- majority of the mob lynching attackers are barely literate, poor and ignorant people who just follow the herd mentality as seen in UP lynching of muslim youth.

Ans: Divorce is the formal end of marriage. It leaves deep impact on the ^{lives} minds of the spouses and their children & families.

~~In the Contemporary Society, the concept of marriages being conceived in heaven or a bond of seven lives is experiencing erosion as evidenced by most frequent cases of marital discord and consequent divorce.~~

- ① Introspect :- what made them marry in the first place - love or family pressure. If it was the former, there's very much a reason to give a second chance to the marriage, to sort out their differences, clear mis-understandings and also to give a thought to the impact of their potential separation on their kids (if any).

You also have to ensure that the process takes place

peacefully and decision is consensual.

If they married because of family pressure, then they ought to reflect, their families would not have chosen a wrong person for them, if they respected ^{consider} their family's decision then, they should do so now.

The parents of the divorcing couple especially the women are seen with much sympathy as burdened with a daughter sitting at home after broken marriage or may be blamed for giving a bad upbringing to her which caused the marriage to break up. These are all stereotypes but very much prevalent in society.

These must also be factored in before finalising divorce.

- ② If both parties have already considered all these factors & still want to go ahead with divorce, the mediator should ensure an unambiguous divorce settlement with clear terms regarding alimony, maintenance of children education & other expenses. The focus would be to ensure that they don't harbour ill will and resentment against each other. Lastly, should wish them luck with their future partners.

(a) Values and Beliefs

(b) Honesty and loyalty

(150 Words) (10 Marks)

Ans! Values :- refers to the personal preferences of people i.e. the things they hold important. For Example, In colonial India, Patriotism was the most important value of Indian society but in the aftermath of LPG reforms Money is the value of Indian society. The two values belong to different fields and are not mutually exclusive.

Beliefs : These are the facts, assumptions, situations which a person believes are true. Beliefs are subject to change with time & acquisition of new information.

For Example : We may believe that all rich people are cruel & indifferent towards the poor. But the next time, we see a rich person helping a poor fellow, our belief regarding the rich people & sk will change in general. This is a preconceived notion. Example for belief - some people believe in God, some don't.

Generally Values

→ Based on upbringing, family society, educational institutions | → shaped by a person's own experiences.

Remarks

Add in both definitions since they do not have fixed boundaries.

→ more or less permanent & deep rooted | → more likely to change

→ values like truth, honesty, loyalty, non-violence are universal. | → Beliefs may vary widely from individual to individual

Honesty :- It refers to the quality of being truthful.

Loyalty :- It refers to the service being faithful towards a particular cause, person, institution i.e. not violating the trust reposed in the person by various actors.

Example to differentiate between the two

The old story of a woman courtier placing her own son in place of the king's son in the cradle when he was being sought to be killed by the enemy king's henchmen. is the best example of loyalty.

Upon being asked whether it is the king's son in the cradle, she responded by pleading ignorance thus not telling a lie. This is honesty while the enemies approached the cradle, announcing to kill the royal heir, she didn't reveal the truth. But she still was honest as she didn't lie.

9. Your sister recently had twins and wants to raise them to have a tolerant and accepting attitudes towards people from different backgrounds. What advice would you give to her? (150 Words) (10 Marks)

Ans: India has a history of harmonious co-existence of diverse religions and composite culture. Yet instances of intolerance by majority towards the minority across religion and Caste has put serious question mark on our tolerance credentials. It is thus, very important for families to bring up their children in a manner that they bear a liberal, tolerant outlook towards the people of other communities.

My advise to my sister regarding upbringing of her twins :-

① Don't be moderate on praising her own religion & exercise restraint in criticising other religions.

② Never talk ill or stereotype any religion with particular evil. Example usage of Muslim-terrorist frequently may lead to negative attitude of children towards muslims.

Remarks

20. Tolerance can be towards any 'other' community—linguistic, ethnic, racial, even national not just religious or caste

③ Enroll them in a school where children of from different religious communities are enrolled so they learn the value of harmonious co-existence

④ Reading bed time stories not only from Hindu scriptures but also from Bible, Quran etc so that they don't feel other religions as alien. & don't harbour suspicion about their values.

⑤ Emphasising less on religion & more on nation & citizen's rights & duties.

⑥ Presenting religion as one of the things to do in life rather than making it the sole agenda of accepting/rejecting people.

⑦ Idolising kings like Ashoka & Akbar early on in life to them rather than emphasizing on Christian enslavement of India or ^{muslim} ~~mosque~~ attacks on temples to loot wealth.

Moreover, Rousseau's objective of letting children decide their religious affiliation after growing up & becoming rational human beings should be adopted to ensure "Sarva dharma Sambhav" survives in India.

Remarks Suggestions are good but you need to have broader perspective of 'community' and advice must be related to overall upbringing (rational mind, scientific temperament)

10. Can you recall instances when stress has had a beneficial effect? Do you believe that you have the traits of resilience?

(150 Words) (10 Marks)

Ans!: stress refers to the state of mind when the person is apprehensive of some unpleasant consequences (eg. of not getting good marks (Students) or losing a deal to rivals etc.)

③ Traits of Resilience : It is the ability to withstand adverse outcomes to our efforts and yet keep on trying.

I believe I do have these traits because I progressed from not knowing "How does the wind blow & what government is" to telling everyone before prelims exam itself that I will clear it. It has been a long time since I started succeeding in the first prelims itself to failing in the next & eventually succeeding again with better strategy.

11. Tobacco smoking is considered to be a fashion and an addiction too which has an established relation with the cancer. The Government has recently decided that 85 per cent a cigarette packet should display a pictorial cancer warning, which the tobacco companies opposed and appealed in the court. But, the court upheld the decision of the government.

(a) Do you think that such a display warning on the packet acts as a deterrent to cigarette smoking?

(b) What are the other ways by which change in attitude and preferences can be brought in people who smoke out of fashion or addiction?

(c) What is the use of prohibiting smoking if it generates revenue on one hand and gives choice and freedom to people to enjoy their lives as they wish? Do you agree? Give reasons.

(250 Words) (20 Marks)

Ans: In keeping with its commitment under the WHO Framework Convention against Tobacco Consumption,

India directed the companies to enlarge the pictorial warnings on cigarette packet. Despite adverse health impact, tobacco consumption is rampant among youth &

aged alike.

a) Display warning on the packet as a deterrent

Yes (1) Seeing the disease inflicted faces of cancer

victims and addicts may feel repulsed & may fear

meeting the same fate. The pictures are indeed

horrible, one can't see them more than once. It is

hard to consume what's inside the packet afterwards.

be brief (2) The family members may also try harder to persuade their people to quit smoking after seeing the horrible consequences of smoking.

(3) People who may find the idea of smoking cool or fashionable after watching movie heroes may also be afraid of smoking after seeing those warnings on the packet of cigarette.

No, pictorial warnings are no sure short deterrents because some hardcore addicts don't pay attention to the packet at all. That's why at metro stations, railway

platforms, or on the footpath, one sees those packets with big pictorial warnings lying, ~~on the~~ after their contents have been consumed.

But large pictorial warnings indeed have prevented attracting new users to certain extent as

revealed in "Citizen for health" survey recently.

b) Ways to bring changes in Attitudes & preferences of smokers :

① celebrity campaigners on "Quit smoking" appeal

Remarks

; Youth is greatly influenced by Movies & TV Shows. It's considered cool to smoke & drink. But once the celebrities themselves appeal to & lead by example by not smoking in public, it can have huge impact.

② Restriction should be imposed on Movies & TV shows regarding visuals of characters smoking, drinking. Recently released movie 'Kabir Singh' shows the hero smoking cigarette or drinking liquor bottles ~80%. of the scenes, likely to leave a negative impression on youth.

③ Mothers, wives, daughters & sisters can be made aware of the dangers of cigarette smoking. They have huge influence on their male relations & can convince them to quit smoking.

④ Cigarettes & Tobacco are called sin goods and attract cess on top of 28%. GST in the new Tax regime. It is indeed a good revenue generator for the govt. excellent explanation

Smoking as choice & freedom

Article 21 guarantees Right to life & liberty to every citizen so they are free to smoke but the Directive principles of state policy under article 47 direct the state to restrict the supply of intoxicant & ensure public health. So State's role is to educate the citizens to enable them to make informed choices in spirit of "welfare state".

In the following questions carefully study the cases presented and answer the questions that follow:

12. You are a senior officer in the electricity department of a state which has power shortage. You notice that your minister has prevailed upon the department in allocation of power supply to different districts in an arbitrary manner. The senior most officer of the department is helping the minister in this objective. Some of the districts have 24 hour power supply whereas some have 8 to 10 hours power cuts. In a visit to a particular district, you notice that some people are not getting even drinking water, because of inadequate power supply. After returning back to state headquarter, you raised the issue with your senior officer and the minister. They asked you to propose a rational solution for the problem.

(a) What are the options available to you?

(b) Evaluate the merits/demerits of each option and finally suggest the best course of action. Give reasons. (250 Words) (20 Marks)

Ans!: In this case, the Senior officer is concerned about the inequitable distribution of power within a power shortage affected state. He is tasked to evolve a rational solution to the problem of mis-allocation.

a) Options Available

(Principle - minister & officer are ready to accept the solution proposed by the concerned officer)

i) Conduct a survey across the state & prepare a detailed report on power requirements in each district & also the present allocation - Surplus & deficit among the districts.

Remarks

finally, estimating the net demand per district & proposing the same to the sr. officer & minister

② see the methodology being adopted in other states regarding power allocation.

③ follow International best practices - Some country that has 100% electrification for households & equitable distribution.

(b) merits/ demerits

① Survey option: A thorough study shall reveal actual requirements of each district & power can be allocated according to demand.

Demerit: A time taking exercise, people may continue to suffer till then.

② Methodology in other states

merit: It may take lesser time from a fresh survey

demerit: ① All states & their requirements of electricity - production & distribution are different, less likely to copy the formulae

Remarks

③ International Best practices

merit: ① Some nations like Norway, Sweden etc have excellent power distribution models. Following their methodology can work wonders here too.

demerit: ① data regarding their popⁿ may not be suited for comparison with Indian state.

② non-uniformity of popⁿ across districts & terrain disuniformity too shall pose hindrances in implementing their best practices.

Best course of action

① Presently supply according to the prevailing methodology & deploying off-grid solar to meet shortages in district with lesser allocation.

② For the longer run, report giving the ground level realities & demands shall be presented to the service & demand-supply equation be worked out to ^{correct} meet the allocation anomaly.

Basic necessities should be fulfilled - main criteria usage of LEDs for government offices, street lights, etc to minimize power consumption - can be added

13. The general elections are in progress and you have been appointed as a sector magistrate to oversee the free, fair, and peaceful conduct of elections in a sector which has 10 polling stations. In course of your tour, you notice a powerful minister moving to various polling stations with lethal weapons. He is accompanied with anti-social elements. The people moving with the minister are intimidating the voters of Scheduled Caste to not go to polling stations to vote. One of the supporters of the minister warns you on your mobile phone that it would be better if you do not interfere and avoid a confrontations with the minister.

What will you do in such a situation? Some of the options are given below. Evaluate the merits and demerits of these options and finally suggest what course of action you would take giving reasons.

- (a) Arrest the minister along with his supporters and seize his arms, ammunition and vehicles, and immediately file a criminal case in the local police station.
- (b) Inform the election control room and seek police reinforcement with instructions regarding what to do.
- (c) Go to the villages inhabited by members of the Scheduled Caste and help them to cast their votes by arranging vehicles.

17. You are a Superintendent of Police and a huge protest is going on in front of your office. These protesters are Human Right activists. The protest is because of two consecutive incidents that happened in your district.

Case one: The city SP has received intelligence that bombs have been planted in various places in the city. The SP asked his team to conduct a massive search operation. After putting in strenuous hard work, the police team raided a house where two people with 2 kg of explosives and IED devices were found. The Police team immediately arrested them and brought them to the police station. Police started interrogating them about the whereabouts of the bombs and their plans. When they failed to get any information from them, one of the Police Officer adopted third degree Torture, in case of new criminals, often works. But one of them died during the process, as he failed to bear the pain of torture. Death in police custody became a big issue.

Case two: Recently communal riots occurred in your area and a few police constables got surrounded by a group, viewing the grave situation and a possible threat on life, one of them used a man as a human shield. They found it to be an easy way to escape. It could also save the life of other police constables. But while they were trying to escape, people started stone pelting and the person who was used as a human shield got badly injured. However, he was saved later by proper treatment.

Answer the following questions:

- Analyse the ethical dilemmas you will face as the SP in both of the above stated situations.
 - Human Rights Activists are demanding action against the officials involved in both the cases. What will be your course of action?
 - The Police Chief of State reaches to you and asks not to take any action, as it would bring down the morale of the police force. What will be your course of action?
 - Can you justify the use of torture in the given circumstances?
 - Would you justify using a human as a shield to save the lives of your colleagues? Give reasons.

Ans: ① Human rights activists are protesting against the violation of human rights of a criminal who died while being subjected to police torture & another person who tried to kill him was part of a mob who tried to kill the police constables

 - Fairly is to disperse the protester as miscreants may join them & possibility of protest turning violent can't be ruled out. So, it will be announced publicly that all the personnel in question have been suspended till conclusion of Enquiry - It is likely to pacify the protest → Simply pacifying the protesters should not be a criteria for suspension since it is a blot on the entire career of the officer.
 - Simultaneously, the SP has to confide in his

Subordinates, if they have acted in good faith, no harm shall come to them.

(c) The SP shall try to convince the ^{state} police chief that requisite procedure is being followed to address the issue and no adverse action against policeman will be taken if they have acted in good faith ^{and in accordance with law}.
