



For instance, the emergence of Caste system negated the spiritual ideal of unity.

The formation of Indian National Congress in 1885, as an assembly of Indians to fight British and to help India regain its lost glory under British rule testifies the statement that one's glory doesn't lie in never falling, but in rising again. INC's continued struggle for political reforms, although briefly punctuated by British machinations, and ultimately gaining independence in 1947 is a mark of this ceaseless struggle to help India rise again.

After gaining independence, the drafters of Indian Constitution had the enormous task of social reformation. From the heydays of spirituality, our society has degenerated to scrouge of casteism and women of subjugation. For these, the Constitution declared the right to equality as the

FUNDAMENTAL RIGHT. This proves that despite having been fallen to a state of social decadence, we again fought back & arose to set the wheel of social transformation roll again and regain our past glory.

On similar lines, we tried to create a more INCLUSIVE SOCIETY. Earlier, under British Raj

The consequent inequity brought great hardships to poor peasants. To set this lacuna right, India embarked on a path of land reforms.

Thus, although our society failed earlier in giving their share of due to poor, our efforts have ensured that we come out of the morass of social equity and help create regain the lost glory of social equity & harmony.

British rule had also led to widespread deindustrialisation and loss of handicraft depended labourers. To overcome this, our planner embarked

During late 1990s, India faced the BALANCE OF PAYMENT CRISIS. It made India to borrow \$7 billion from IMF, as it did not even had a fortnight of foreign exchange reserves left to repay interest on foreign loans. Our economy failed miserably. However, this set back became turning point in economic revival of our nation. Adoption of structural reforms in the form of Liberalisation, Privatisation and Globalisation led to India becoming one of world's largest possessor of foreign exchange reserve, which in 2018 stood at \$420 billion. It, therefore, strengthens the contention that glory lies not in never falling, but in rising again everytime we fall.

Even in recent times, the continued demands of economic development has led to

growing environmental crisis. According to a WHO report, India has 10 of the 20 most polluted cities of the world. This shows our failure in ensuring healthy environment to our citizenry. However, the commitment which India made at PARIS CLIMATE CONFERENCE of increasing the share of renewable energy production and its ambitious Intended Nationally Determined Contributions (INDC) bodes well for a

healthy environment for India. Therefore, although we had failed initially, yet we are trying to make an agreement, which actually gives us the glory.

Towards end, it is therefore pertinent to analyse the significance the spirit of persistence has in human endeavour. As the above analysis has shown, efforts never go in

The Indian National Congress pursued the goal for an independent India with dogged persistence. So does our constitution. Lawmakers tried to rectify social-ills facing our society. TOPIC; Science & Technology revolutionize our lives, but memory, tradition and myth frame our response.

In human lives, perception plays plays an important role in determining human actions/ response. The nature of socialisation one is exposed due during upbringing gives rise to emergence of Memory, tradition and myths which play a decisive role in one's day-to-day conduct.

Inheritance of these memory, tradition & myth from previous generations and their subsequent passage to succeeding generation gives rise to a cyclical process which keeps on repeating generation after generation.

In modern times, science and technology has begun to play a rather more significant role

in a person's daily life. Its revolutionary effect is visible in complex medical procedures to every-day usage of cell phones for communications. Yet, this revolution has not permeated beyond superficial levels and [memory], [tradition] and [myth] continue to exercise their influence.

Take the recent USA elections, for example. USA has 99% literacy rate. It has world's second largest number of internet based cellular connectivity users. Yet the prevalence of fake news on social media platforms, which relied on mythical news to spread misinformation proved adequate to help Republicans win. This is strange because one might expect such a literate and technologically advanced populace to not be swayed by myth. Yet their response, as visible in voter behaviour proved contrary.

In considering the role of technology in economic sphere, arrival of technologies such as FINTECH, ARTIFICIAL INTELLIGENCE, BIG DATA etc., have helped economic agents make sound predictions for future. However, this isn't the case always, and especially in India, one can see ~~large~~ ^{big} industrialists resorting to astrologers to make future predictions. Thus the Indian tradition of dependence on astrology exists large in face of scientific and technological development.

Unfortunately, in India, usage of technology, although brought with novel purposes, has been more ^{determined} by its traditions. For instance, use of Ultrasound machines ^{was} intended to

help recognise developmental deformities at early stage of foetus development. However, its response is visible in its ~~blatant~~ blatant misuse for ^{female} sex determination. This shows the tradition of treating daughter as a burden and continues even to this day and for which the technical revolution of ultrasound machine is proving as an assistance.

Internet-based cellular connectivity has revolutionized communication. Especially instant messaging using services such as WhatsApp, people have been able to share and connect with peers more securely. However, its use for sharing incendiary posts to foment social trouble, seen most recently during lynchings by cow vigilante groups on suspicion of beef trading and consumption brings to light India's responses. These responses

are a product of tradition of no-beef consumption and a memory of protecting cows, such emotional responses prove how latest mediums of communication are actually used in perpetuating responses based on medieval conceptions.

Even in domain of law, prevalence of Section 377 (IPC) in law book of India, which criminalises consensual gay sex between adults and which is used to harass LGBT community members, shows how science and technological development has remained untouched to it. The American Psychiatric Society had removed homosexual orientation from the list of psychological disorder. Yet, response of Indian judiciary as well as its people towards members of this community is visible in the form of prejudices, stereotyping, discrimination etc. These are

again a reflection of societal memory, tradition and myth, towards members of LGBT community.

Indians never have great reverence towards its rivers. This is specially true for the River Ganga. Millions come to take a dip in its holy waters to ^{get off} rid themselves of sins. Yet, it needs to be highlighted that the Central Pollution Control Board has designated certain stretches of the River Ganga so polluted that it is unfit for drinking and bathing. These conclusions have been derived based on scientific analysis of river's water. Yet, people give short shrift to this advisory and out of reverence their response, by drinking river's water & taking bath, shows that scientific & technological advices do not play any role in their behaviour.


