



Humility is 'down to earth' behaviour of an individual. It is a virtue 'pare excellence' which can give rise to other virtues like purity, charity and obedience.

A humble person is 'pure' in his/her intentions and conduct. For example, Dr. A.P.J. Abdul Kalam was a humble person who was pure at heart and despite becoming President of India, he lived frugally without any show off. *Do you think humility is an asset for self-improvement?*

Similarly, a humble person is oriented towards charity and obedience. This can be understood from the example of 'Karna' from Mahabharat. He was an ideally humble person who considered 'Daan' i.e. charity as his Dharma and was very obedient to his teacher Parashurama.

At personal level, I believe I am a humble person. It is an important trait in one's character that is always appreciated by others and give self confidence and self respect.

2. Why is there a conflict between religion and rationality? Which of them is a better guide for the promotion of morality in society? Is being rational also being just and fair? (150 Words) (10 Marks)

Religion is essentially a 'group held belief' which consists of - Rituals, Mythology, Philosophy, Ethics and spirituality as its appendages.

Most of the times, people ~~consider~~ equate Rituals and mythology with religion and a little more ignorance lead it to superstitions. This results into conflict between religion and rationality. For example, Triple Talaq as a social practice is associated with a religion but it is irrational as stated by Honourable Supreme Court.

But a better understanding of religion can equate it logically to its ethical, philosophical and spiritual dimensions where it can complement rationality. This was promoted by great religious reformers like Swami Vivekanand and Sayed Ahmed Khan.

Religion has a greater hold on the beliefs of masses. So, definitely, it can be a more influential way to promote morality in society. This was expressed as an idea in Economic Survey 2019-20 where 'Behavioral Economics' was promoted as a tool to influence people. But in a population

which is educated and scientifically advanced, rationality can be a better tool. For example, western societies extract their moral values from rational principles mostly.

Rationality can not be equated with being just an fair in true sense. For example, a rationality based on social progress deriving from economic growth can lead to social inequality which is not just an fair. It must be equated with principles of human rights and Ethics which form a prominent part of Religion.

a) Society runs on certain established principles and laws. If these laws are not followed, the systems in society are jeopardised and anarchy prevails. Justice done by mob is one such activity which breach the established laws of society. Hence, justice can never be promoted by a mob. For example, mob lynching of a person because of consuming meat is not justified. It is the breakdown of legal machinery and a threat to peace and prosperity of society.

b) India is a democracy where we have a written set of rules in form of Constitution along with many other legal documents. If

these laws are not exercised in letter and spirit, people get resentments. For example, there is law of death penalty in case of murderer and rape. But the culprits are not persecuted in timebound fashion, making people anxious and angry with law and legal agencies. Then they try to go for extrajudicial acts to punish the perpetrators equating it with instant justice. This is not a healthy attitude and systemic changes are required to curb such attitudes.

ii) General deterioration of respect towards laws in people's hearts.

iii) Lack of ethics and morality

iii) If he was not able to justify his actions then, I would definitely criticize him for his lax approach and warn him not to repeat it in future.

- vi) Necessary motivation must be incorporated with critical evaluation.

A true leader always use emotional intelligence to be critical towards his/her subordinates. It will instill discipline and motivation in subordinate and enhance the respect of leader in the heart of subordinate.

6. How does culture influence conformity, compliance, and obedience? Argue and illustrate. (150 Words) (10 Marks)

Culture is a sum total of traditions and social beliefs about all the aspects of public life. It is influenced by history, geography, ethics, anthropology, customs, social values etc.

The process of indoctrination of culture in an individual is called socialization. It forms the part of PERSONALITY of individual and becomes the most important part of his/her identity. For example, a person from North East derives his/her name, language, food preferences, clothing, demeanour etc from his/her culture which is his/her identity.

How culture influences -:

i) Conformity : every individual wants to be a part of 'social group' to fulfill his/her need of social relatedness to group. Cultural principles conform his/her behaviour in favour of a social behaviour appropriate to the social group he/she wants to be a part of. for example, even in modern times, in several setup women don't wear western dresses to conform to social norms.

ii) Compliance : It implies accepting a behaviour or idea out of respect to something. People receive and

appreciate their cultural values and hence show compliance towards it. ex, A Hindu women in United States wear saree during Diwali festival to appreciate her native culture.

iii) Obedience : It implies accepting a behaviour under the influence of an authority. If the authority is promoting cultural principles, obedience is generated. For example, Khap panchayats issue orders to uphold their so called 'culture' to gain obedience from rural people.

a) Values are beliefs with some worth is attached. Values are essentially the subset of beliefs. For example, honesty is a value which is essentially a personal and social belief which is appreciated and a positive worth is attached to it.

A Belief is any idea or psychological construct that comes to the mind of an individual. Beliefs when held on generate values which in turn generate ethics and morals. For example, it can be believed that lightening is caused by Gods in sky. If positive or negative worth is attached to it, it becomes Value.

b) Honesty is a positive value which means always being true to oneself and one's conduct and behaviour vis a vis others. Honesty is a supreme value and is greatly appreciated by society. For example, Mahatma Gandhi was honest in his conduct during the exam where he refused to cheat. His conduct is still remembered.







- ① Putting a small 'user charge' for these amenities so that they become self sustained and are maintained properly.
- ② Ensure better civic sense in public by advertisements and recping in famous personalities and leaders.





17. You are a Superintendent of Police and a huge protest is going on in front of your office. These protesters are Human Right activists. The protest is because of two consecutive incidents that happened in your district.

Case one: The city SP has received intelligence that bombs have been planted in various places in the city. The SP asked his team to conduct a massive search operation. After putting in strenuous hard work, the police team raided a house where two people with 2 kg of explosives and IED devices were found. The Police team immediately arrested them and brought them to the police station. Police started interrogating them about the whereabouts of the bombs and their plans. When they failed to get any information from them, one of the Police Officer adopted third degree. Torture in case of new criminals, often works. But one of them died during the process, as he failed to bear the pain of torture. Death in police custody became a big issue. Unnatural death

Case two: Recently communal riots occurred in your area and a few police constables got surrounded by a group, viewing the grave situation and a possible threat on life, one of them used a man as a human shield. They found it to be an easy way to escape. It could also save the life of other police constables. But while they were trying to escape, people started stone pelting and the person who was used as a human shield got badly injured. However, he was saved later by proper treatment.

Answer the following questions:

- Analyse the ethical dilemmas you will face as the SP in both of the above stated situations.
- Human Rights Activists are demanding action against the officials involved in both the cases. What will be your course of action?
- The Police Chief of State reaches to you and asks not to take any action, as it would bring down the morale of the police force. What will be your course of action?
- Can you justify the use of torture in the given circumstances?
- Would you justify using a human as a shield to save the lives of your colleagues? Give reasons.

d) Many a times police use torture to extract information from accused. But torture is a violation of human rights. Article 22 of Constitution provides for certain rights which when combined with Article 21 i.e. Right to life then it becomes grossly inadequate to use torture to extract information. It is a brutal tool in the hands of law enforcement agencies which is often used arbitrarily to set scores with incarcerated persons.


